



There is a museum in the Philippines that lets people be a part of the art by using **optical illusions**. Korean artists made the paintings.

The paintings are **three dimensional** and because people can get very close to or inside the paintings, they look like they are in the paintings when someone takes their photograph from certain **angles**. There are over a hundred paintings to be a part of that, including new and classic paintings.

The museum wants to add more paintings and wants to offer a workshop to students to teach them how to make this kind of art.

Difficult words: **optical illusion** (a trick for the eyes), **three dimensional** (appearing to have depth or height), **angle** (a position where you look from).
