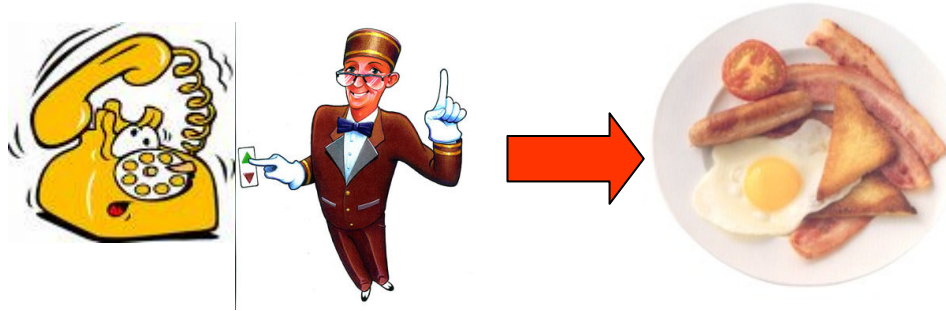


# Room service ( ordering meals )

**Room service:** So I'm going to repeat your order sir.

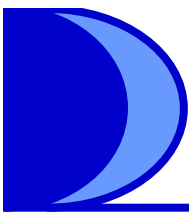
**Jun:** Okay!

<b>VOCABULARY</b>	<b>MEANING</b>
<b>1. What would you like to have?</b>	- Eggs with the yolks and whites beaten together and cooked to a firm but soft consistency
<b>2. How do you like your eggs?</b>	- Fried only on one side.
<b>3. Scrambled egg</b>	-Asking what the person wants to order.
<b>4. Sunny side-up</b>	- Eggs cooked by sautéing in oil or butter; sometimes turned and cooked on both side
<b>5. Fried</b>	- Asking how the costumer would like the egg to be cooked. Like scrambled, sunny side-up, boiled and fry.
<b>6. Boiled egg</b>	- Immersing the egg in boiling water with their shells unbroken.

<b>7. Crisp</b>	- Confirming the order
<b>8. I'd like to order...</b> - Can I have? - I would like some...	- The ordered food will be delivered in a few minutes.
<b>9. That's right</b> - that's correct	- Hard but easily breakable; brittle. It makes a crispy sound.
<b>10. Your order will be right with you.</b> - Your order will be served in a few minutes.	- Telling someone's order to a waiter or waitress.
