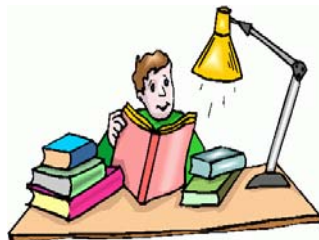


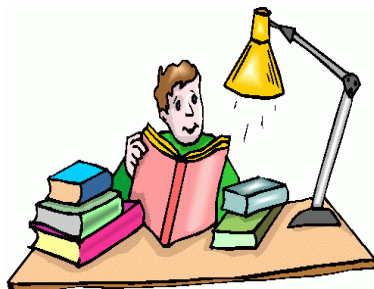

<p>Have/has to -when something necessary and you have no choice to</p>	<p>Don't have to -when something is NOT necessary or not required</p>
<p>-we use have to with I, you, we and they Ex. I have to study for tomorrow's exams</p>	<p>- we use don't have to I, you, we and they Ex. I don't have to do the laundry. My mom does it for me.</p>
<p>we use has to with it, he ,she Ex. He has to clean the house before his parents arrive.</p>	<p>we use doesn't have to with it, he ,she Ex. He doesn't have to clean the house.</p>
<p>Had to is used in the past. Ex. He had to go to the supermarket.</p>
